

Celebrating our first year!

If you've been following our work over this past year, you know that we are heterodox and motley crew of people who are not happy with trans activism, which is saturated by the blurry, rebellious language of queer theory. We value human rights but we won't distort reality in order to achieve them.

We set out to counter queer theory by putting gender dysphoria front and centre in order to showcase the myriad of experiences that are housed under the term "trans". It is quite tricky to do this without distressing somebody who is struggling with gender dysphoria. We know the pain.

We realize we were not "assigned" a sex at birth and that we cannot change our sex. Early in childhood, we began to struggle terribly with a perceived mismatch between our sex and what we felt we were. Eventually, we chose to take drastic measures to treat our suffering. We don't pretend to have invented another sex. When we say we're trans, we mean that we present ourselves as the opposite sex in order to manage our dysphoria, which we experience in different degrees, in different ways, in different times.

At the same time, we don't argue about whether trans people exist. We ourselves have passed through stages of thinking that we don't hold to anymore. We are patient about that, but we are proactive in telling our stories and the stories of detransitioners in order to highlight hasty surgeries and medicalization that are administered without proper psychological screening. We believe we have/would have benefitted from proper screening and exploratory psychotherapy, although we take responsibility for our decisions. We are especially focused on slowing down the conveyor belt that is the "informed consent" model, which is a dangerous abandonment of normal health care.

We want to remind everyone that GDA members do not agree on everything. We have very different views on politics, religion, morality and society. What holds us together is our determination to tell our stories and provide a microphone for others who, like us, believe queer theory is a disastrous lie.

As a team of volunteers, our expenses have been small – basic podcast equipment, web hosting, software subscriptions and the like. We're grateful for the donations we've received from individual supporters, which have covered our costs. We plan to undertake initiatives that will require more financial help in 2022. We've received requests for short educational videos and printed resources about gender dysphoria that are evidence-based, which we'd like to create. We look forward to another year ahead!

A message from our founder

What a year this has been!

We first launched in January 2021 – two Canadian transmen concerned about ideological capture and the impact of that on our healthcare system, our public education system, on women and children, and the LGB community. We created Gender Dysphoria Alliance Canada as a lightning rod, believing that there must be other transpeople out there who see these problems and the harms unfolding before us. Boy, were we ever right! We've met many wonderful, intelligent, and interesting people over this past year and rebranded as an international organization.

We've received many letters and comments from different people: Christians saying "you're doing God's work". Women thanking us for supporting their sex-based rights. Trans people who were previously captured by queer theory telling us that our work has changed their perspective. Transitioned people who wrote to tell us that we've given them the courage to detransition. Parents whose kids fit the ROGD profile, telling us that voices like ours have supported them while they're framed as "transphobes" for voicing concerns.

We had no idea what shape this would take or who we would reach. We're just a small group of people in different places, with different backgrounds, volunteering our spare time to help correct the narrative about gender dysphoria. It's been a steep learning curve. It's been time away from our spouses and children. We're humbled that people are listening.

"The personal is political."

Thinking about how and what we could effectively contribute to this cause, we decided that our most valuable asset against a distorted narrative is our own stories, which we tell as honestly as we can and encourage others to do the same. I believe in the transformational power of truth-telling, and continue to learn about myself through this work.

Drawing from the talents of our team - Aaron Terrell's sharp observations, Mars' use of media, Buck's many years in the trans community, my background as a mental health provider and graphic designer, Janet's pragmatic thinking, and Kenneth's activism experience... we've made use of different media to transmit our message. Our blog has become a collection of testimonies and articles, and our podcast, Transparency, has been a place for slow, meandering, gentle, nuanced conversations and explorations. Several months ago, we learned that Transparency made the list of one of the top podcasts in Hungary! (Hello Hungary!)

We wish to thank all those who have supported us in numerous ways: donations, advice, collaborations and friendships. We've learned so much from many of you who are doing amazing work against the current and often in the face of criticism and skepticism.

We plan to all take a break over the holidays to refresh ourselves with our loved-ones. We hope you're doing the same. We look forward to joining you again in the new year.

2022 will be a year of breakthroughs!
